Executive Summary

- There were three homicides during the 1st Quarter of 2023, a 38% reduction from the five-year average. None of the homicides year-to-date were domestic-motivated.
- Reported sexual offences decreased 6% from average in the 1st Quarter. This year saw a high volume of sexual assaults involving a weapon or causing bodily harm, although a similar volume was also noted in the 1st quarter of 2022.
- A 7% increase of assaults was noted in the 1st quarter compared to average with noteworthy increases of assault against peace officers and aggravated assaults. The 1st quarter of 2023 saw a similar volume of assaults compared to the same quarter in 2022.
- The presence of weapons in violent crime increased 7% in the 1st quarter driven mostly by an increase of verbal threats and the use of other weapons.
- There was an average volume of robberies in the 1st quarter with most robbery types noting declines, with the exception of a 20% over average increase of person robberies.
- The number of victims of domestic violence declined 8% from the 5-year average in the 1st Quarter. Reports of domestic conflict increased by 6% over average.
- Property crime volumes were average in the 1st Quarter of 2023 with notable declines across most Break & Enter types as well as a 17% reduction of vehicle thefts.
- The number of young offenders identified fell in line with the five-year average during the 1st Quarter with property crime involvement the only noteworthy increase (+10%).
- The total number of police service requests was 3% lower than the five-year average in the 1st Quarter; Citizen use of the online reporting system grew by 100%. During the 1st Quarter police attended an average of 986 calls a day. Online citizen reports averaged 71 per day.
- There was a 5% reduction in calls about disorderly behaviours in the 1st Quarter. Similar to the 4th Quarter of 2022, calls about mental health concerns, unwanted guests and disturbances increased. Disorder calls accounted for an average of 221 calls a day from the public in the 1st Quarter of 2023.

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REPORT NOTES

Most of the statistical data in this report is derived from the Calgary Police Service records management system (SENTRY). Disorder data is derived from the Computer aided Dispatch (CAD) system. Data is compiled by the Corporate Data and Analytics Team of the Bureau of Service & Community Support.

Reporting is based on the most serious offence in the incident. Please note that offences are assigned to the month in which the offence was *reported*, which is not necessarily the month the offence occurred. The reported date is the first point in time at which the police were notified of the offence and reporting lag may vary due to circumstances (these are typically property crimes where the victim did not report the offence until a later date, or was unaware of the loss until a later date, or late-reported sexual assaults). Also note that “attempted” offences are included in these totals. Violent crime, excluding robbery, is counted by the number of victims, using the most serious offence against the victim. Robbery, and all other crime, is counted by incident using the most serious offence in the incident. Of note, cases are often cleared months and sometimes years later. Consequently, clearance rates for previous years may appear to be much higher than those of the present year. Cases “cleared by charge” and those “cleared otherwise” are included in these clearance rate totals.

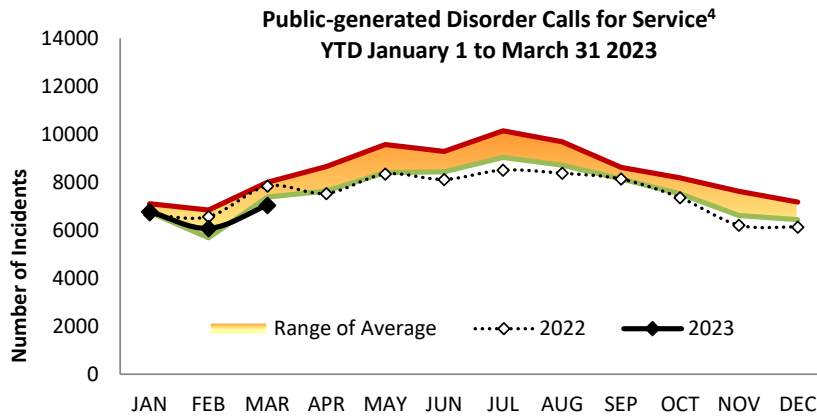

The implementation of the new provincial legislation (Provincial Administrative Penalties Act) has resulted in a significant reduction in impaired offences under the Criminal Code as most first time impaired drivers will be subject to only an IRS:FAIL (the specific administrative penalty under the Traffic Safety Act for criminal level impaired driving offences), unless the incident results in death or serious bodily harm or other significant aggravating factors in which case criminal charges should also be pursued.
