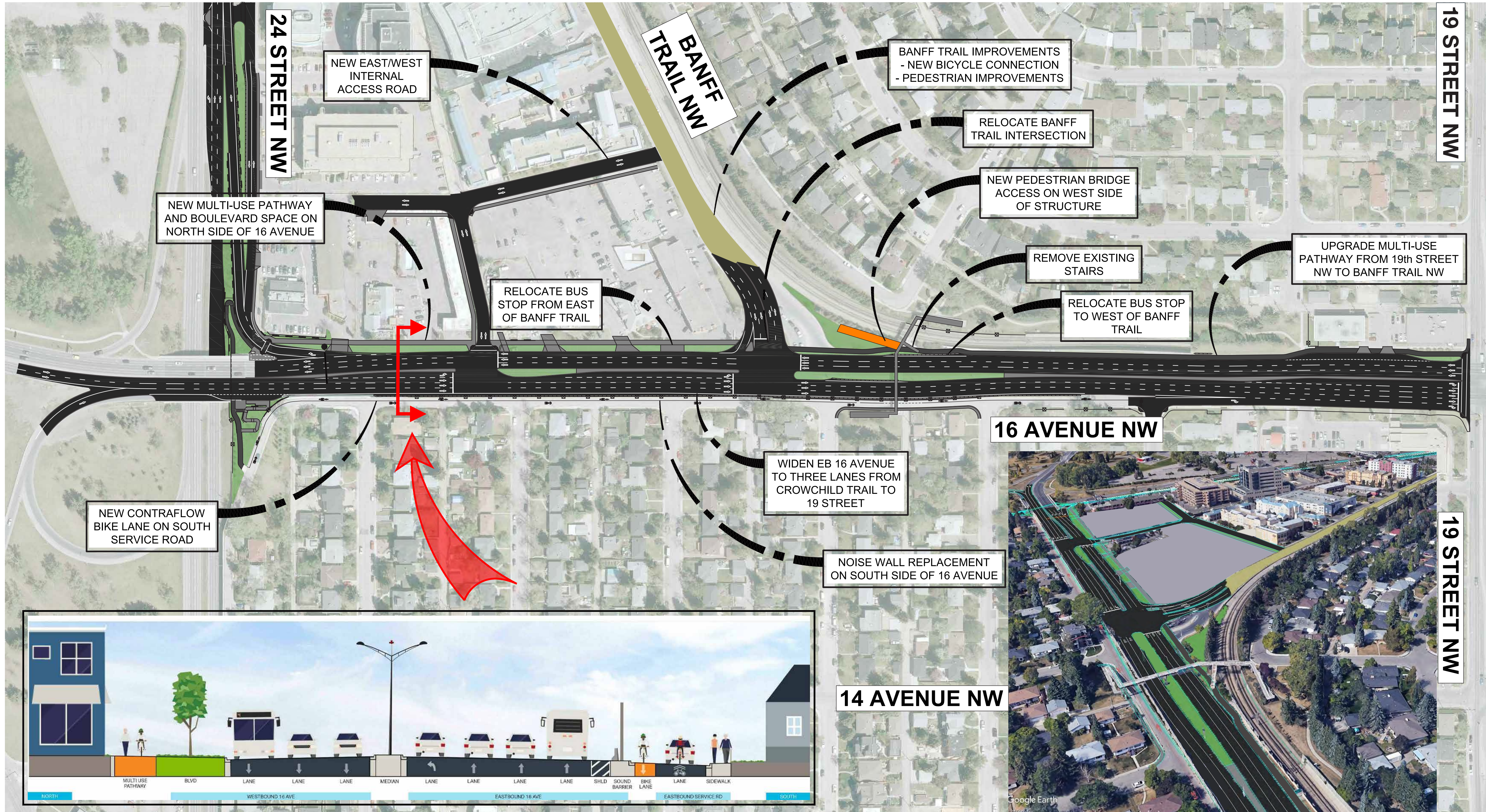

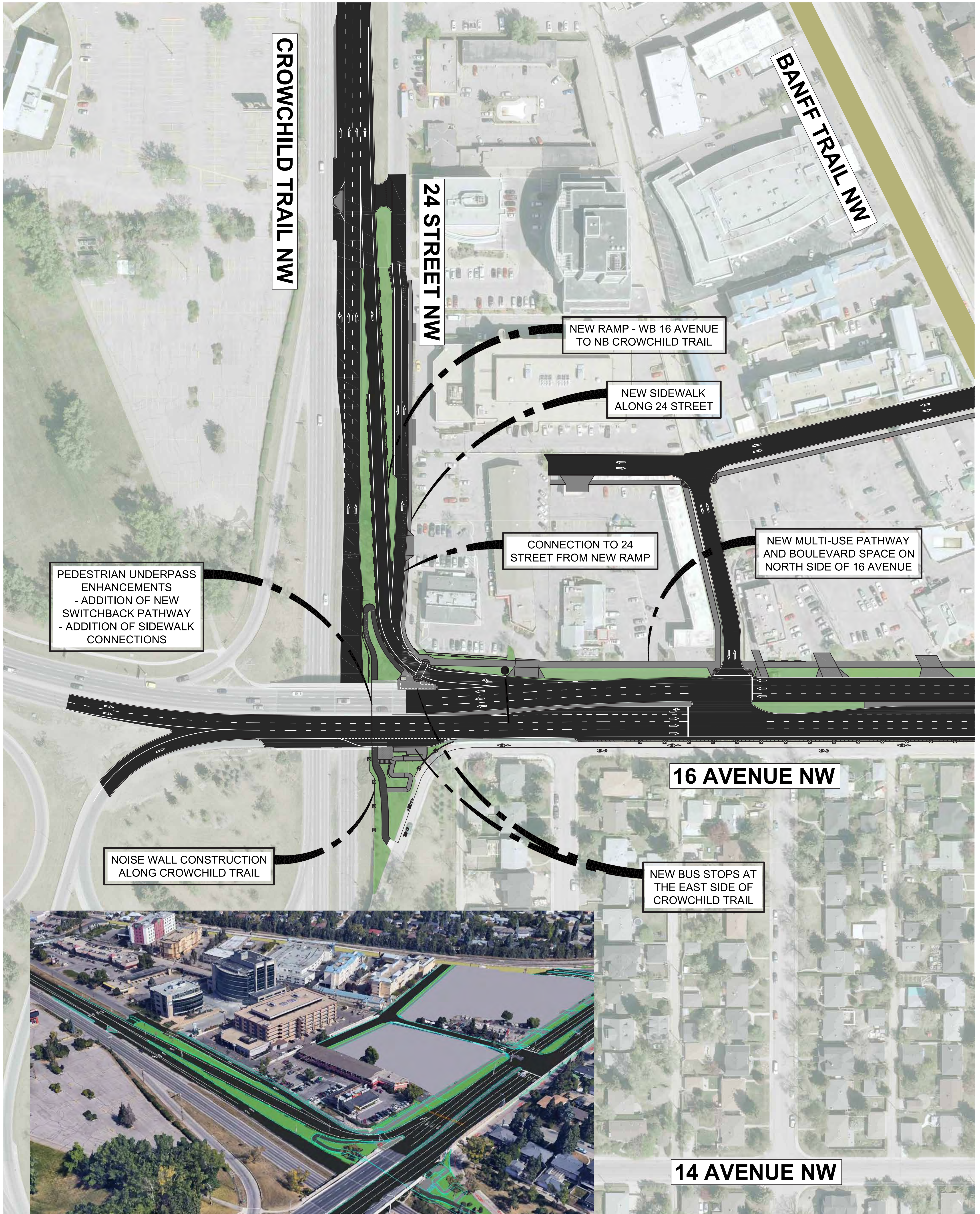

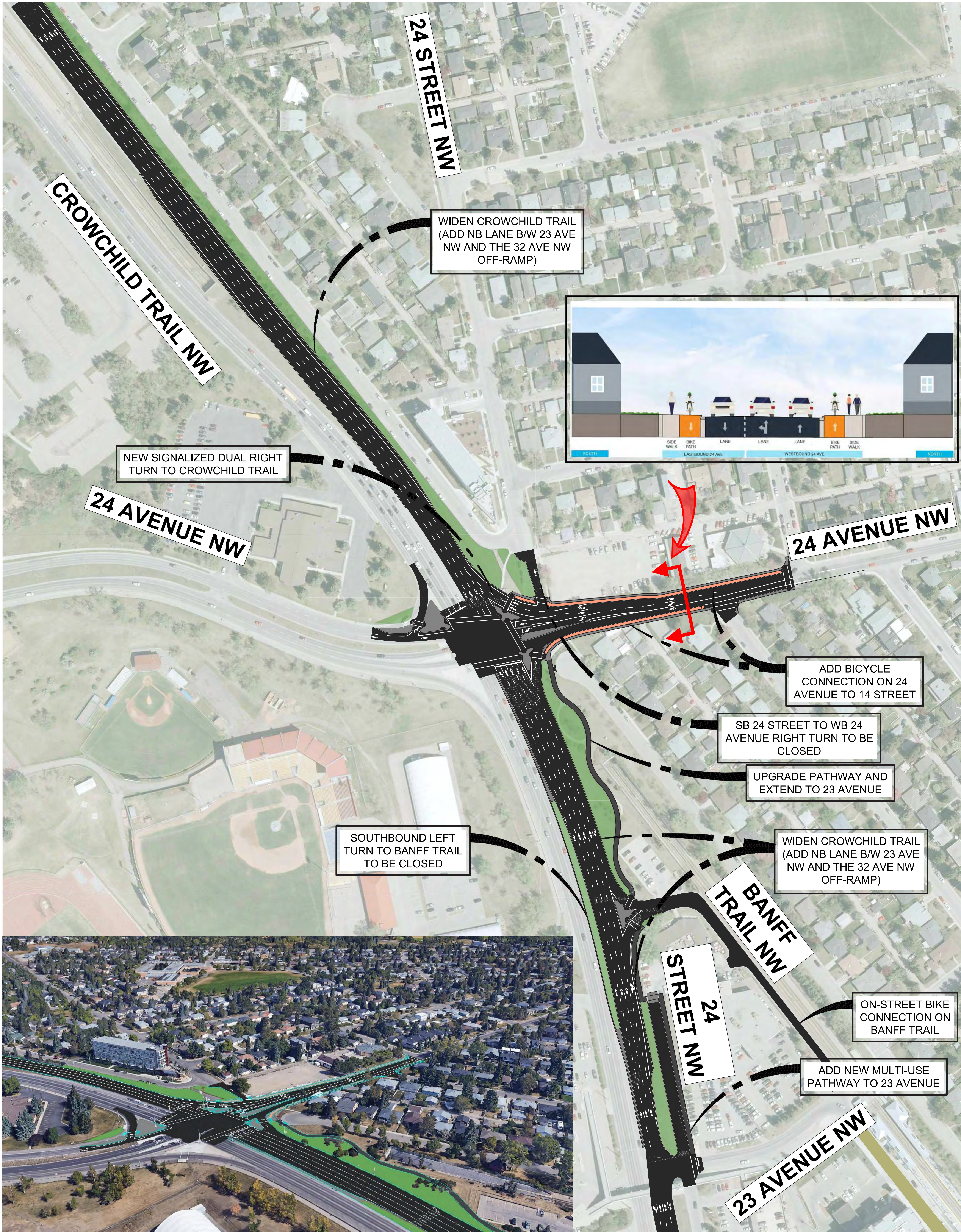
16 Avenue N.W. Lane Widening from Crowchild Trail N.W. to 20A Street N.W.



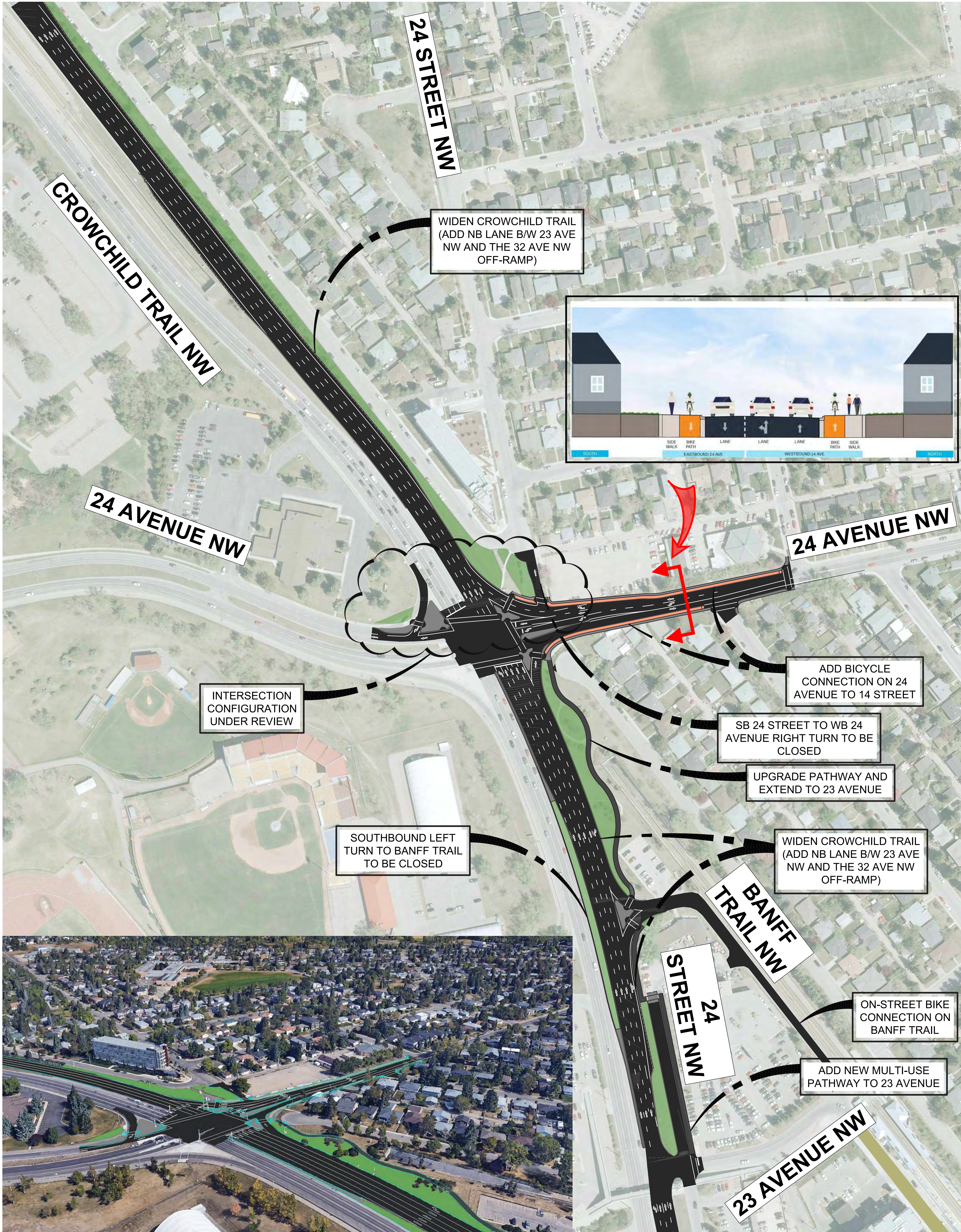
Westbound 16 Avenue N.W. Off-ramp to Northbound Crowchild Trail N.W.



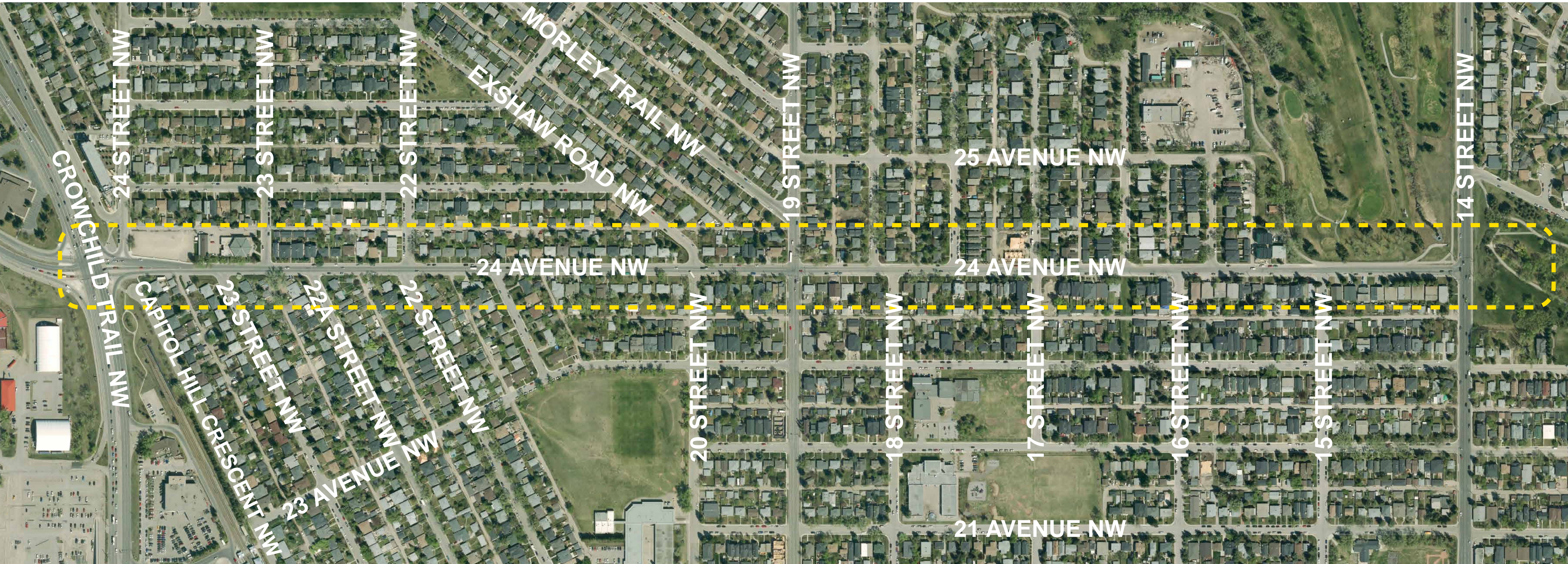
Intersection Improvements at Crowchild Trail N.W. and 24th Avenue N.W.

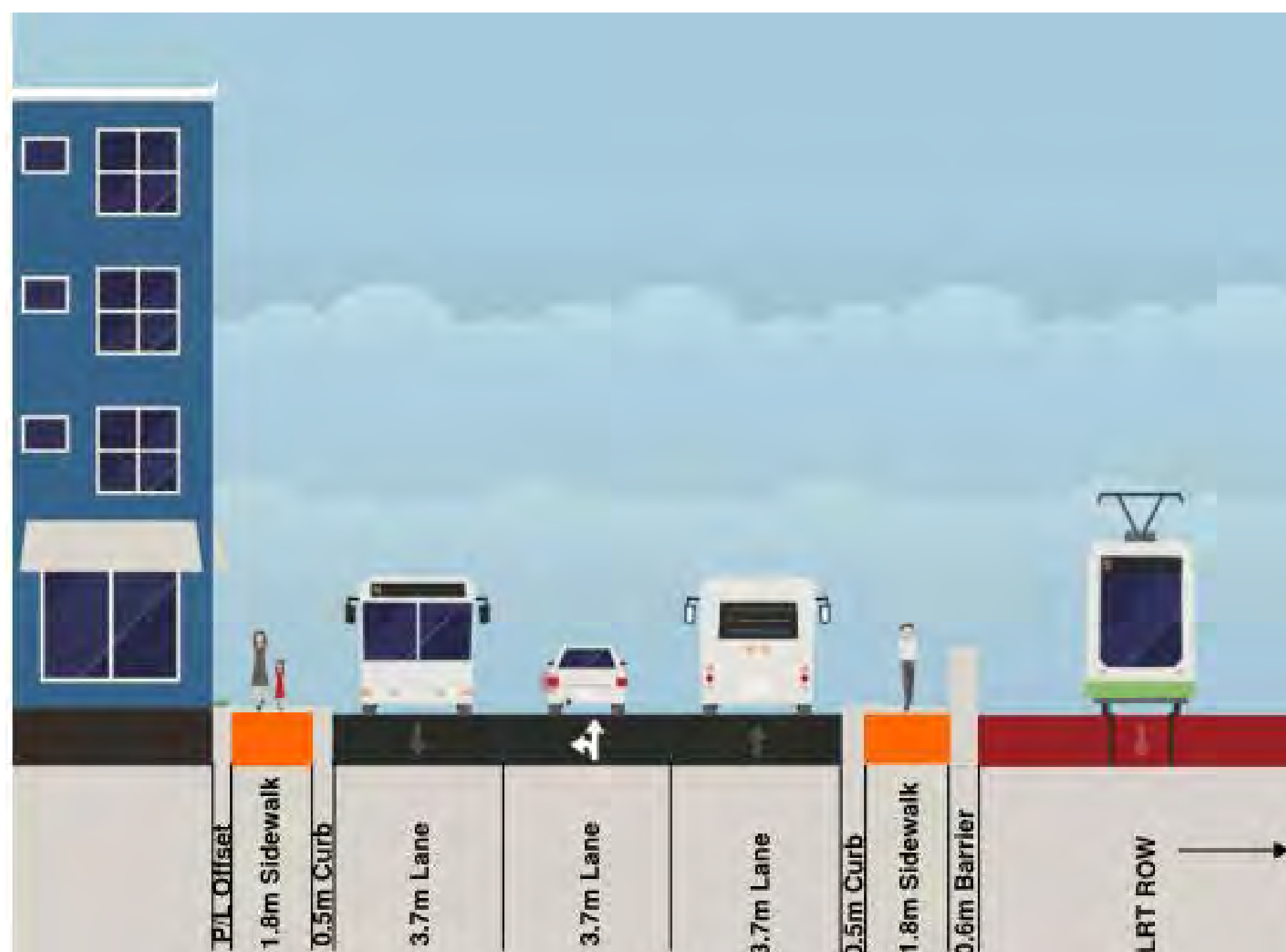

Banff Trail N.W. cross-section

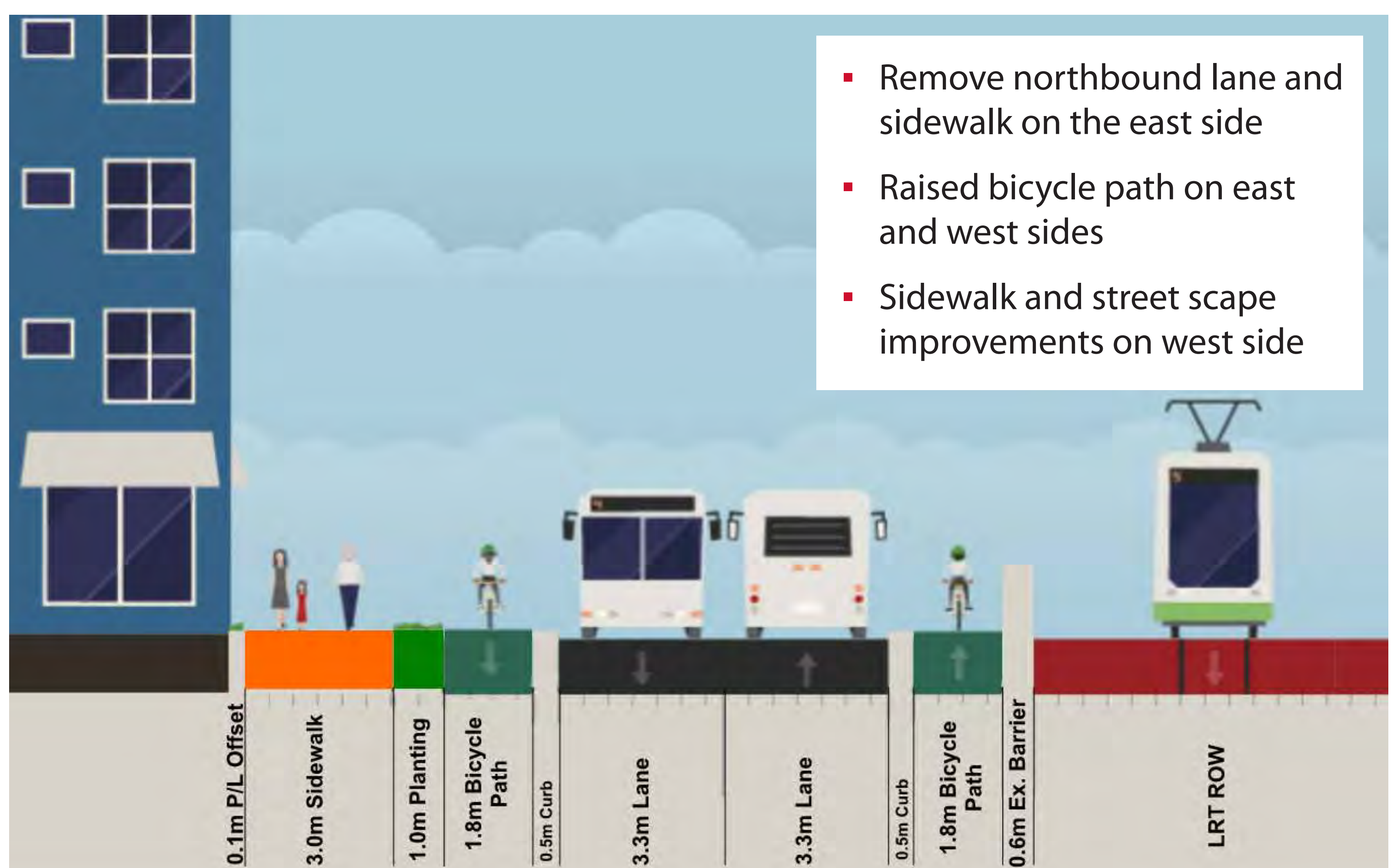
The work we are doing along the Banff Trail N.W. corridor is in alignment with the Banff Trail Area Redevelopment Plan.

Existing Banff Trail cross-section:



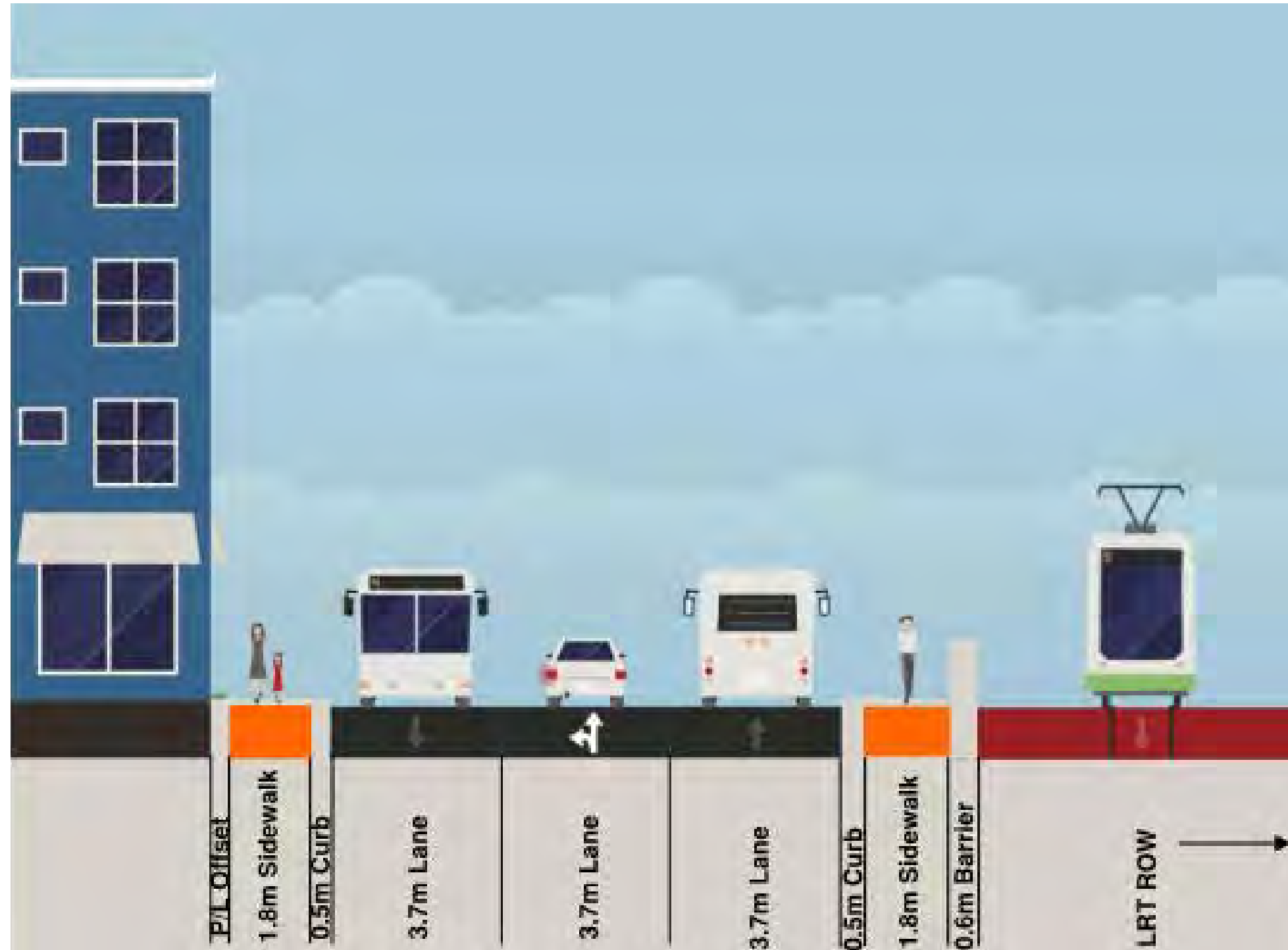

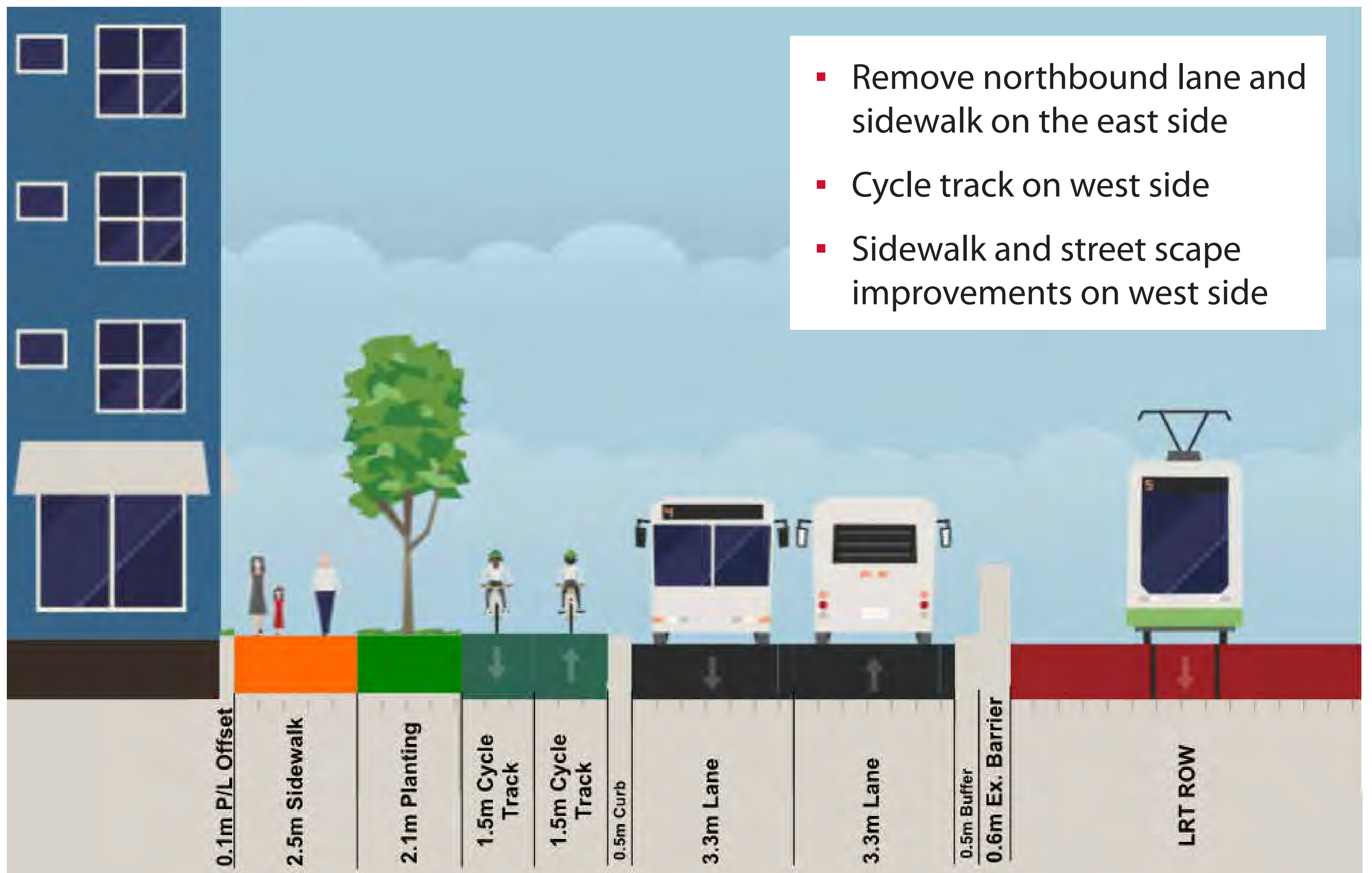
- Remove northbound lane and sidewalk on the east side

Existing Banff Trail cross-section:

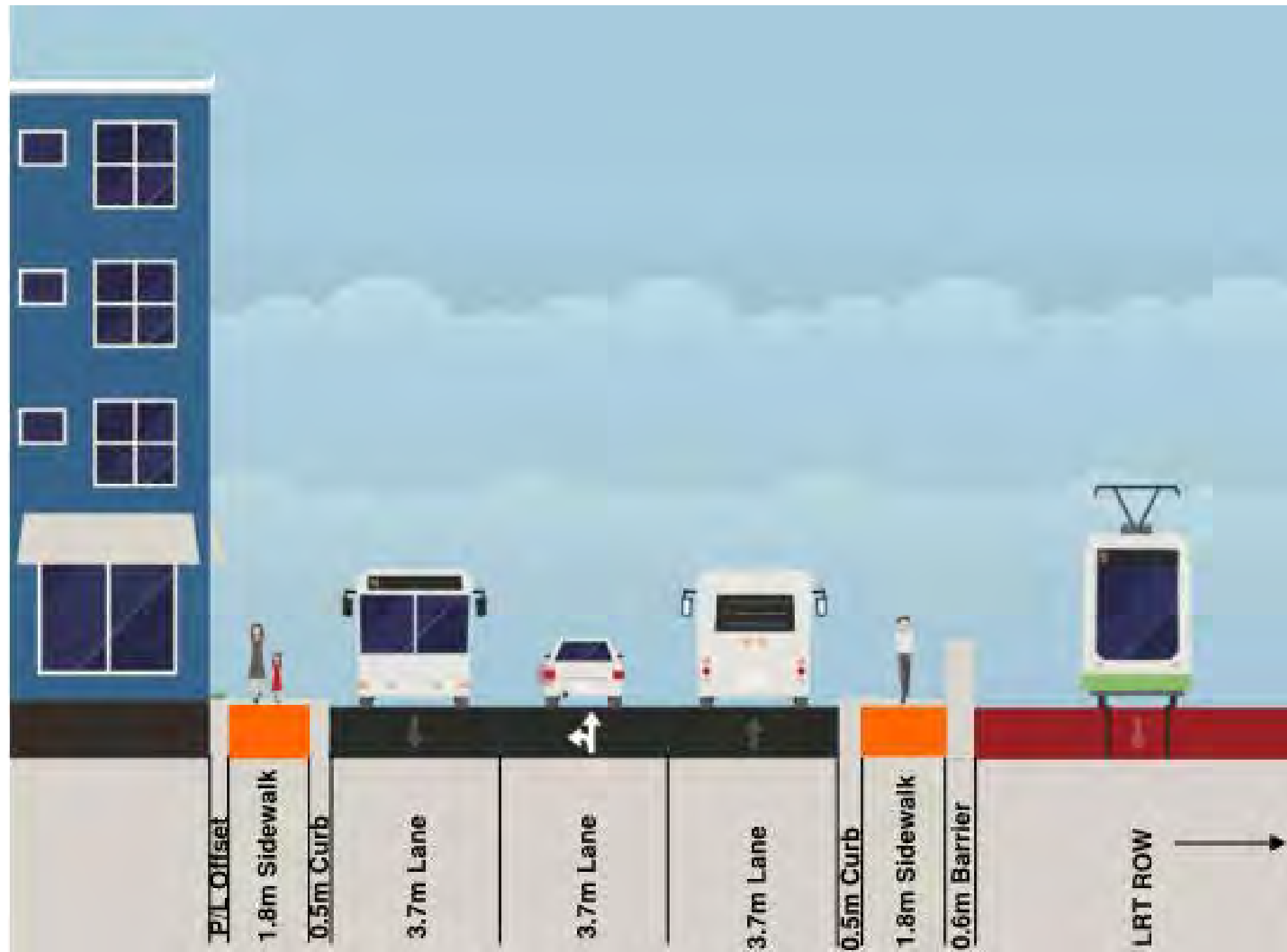

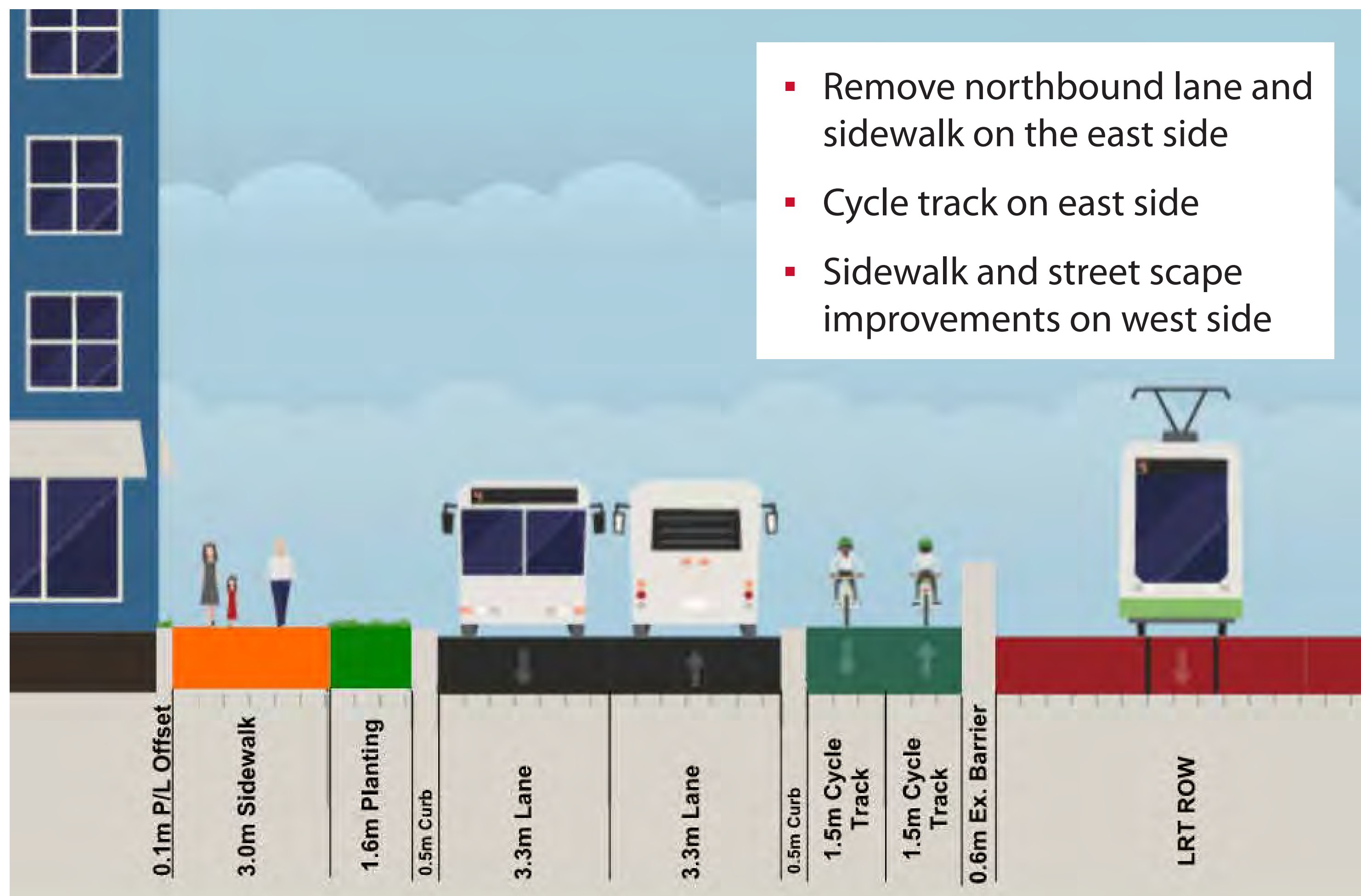

What we heard

From our community engagement last fall, the following themes emerged:

- Desire for sidewalks throughout the Motel Village area to be widened
- Increase mobility and accessibility
- Desire for increased lighting in the Crowchild Trail underpass
- No desire for permeability in the noise wall on the south side of 16 Avenue N.W.

Last year's engagement

What we did (cont.)

Below are the themes that were identified as factors in our engagement, and the confirmed scope based on this feedback:

Theme	Confirmed Scope
<p>Increase mobility and accessibility</p>	<p>Build a new ramp connecting to the existing pedestrian bridge near Banff Trail. The pedestrian bridge is not to be replaced.</p>
	<p>Extend active modes and public realm improvements along Banff Trail N.W. from 16 Avenue N.W. to 23 Avenue N.W.</p>
<p>A desire for increased lighting in the underpass</p>	<p>Enhance pedestrian underpass at Crowchild Trail & 16 Avenue N.W. including lighting and new pathway.</p>
<p>A desire for sidewalks throughout the Motel Village area to be widened</p>	<p>Improvements to the public realm on the north side of 16 Avenue N.W., adding sidewalks on 24 Street N.W., and improving the public realm on Banff Trail N.W.</p>
<p>No desire for permeability in the noise wall on the south side of 16 Avenue N.W.</p>	<p>Replacement of the noise wall insulating Briar Hill Community.</p>
	<p>No new openings in noise wall are being added.</p>
